Director's Note

The "social model of disability' is a term coined by disability rights activists from the 1970s and 80s. It describes the idea that if society was accessible and built for disabled peopled, then disabled individuals would not be excluded from the world around them. It views the idea of disability as a mental attitude from and structure of society rather than a medical condition of any individual.

I fell in love with *Amy and the Orphans* by Lindsey Ferrentino during my junior year of undergrad in my "Disability in the Theatre" course, taught by the wonderful Joseph Paul Hill and Kate Farrington. In society we tend to put disabled folks out of the visible eye and not listen to their voices, continuing the long history of silencing the disabled. Though I do not have Down syndrome, I believe Amy's story resonates with many folks with a range of disabilities.

It is truly an honor to be making my ATX directing debut as a disabled artist with a show that highlights disability and shows that we as a society should meet disabled people where they are. Thank you Lisa Scheps and GFT, my Doctuh Mistuh Productions family, Johanna Pinzler, Joseph Paul Hill, Kate Farrington, Elisabeth Motley, and Adam Cico for your support!
