Playwrights' Note

It's been a tough decade for transgender people in Texas, with relentless attacks that seek to weaponize a fear of the unknown for political gain. The bathroom bills, the sports bans, and worst of all, the denial of potentially life-saving medical care for trans minors, care that is accepted by all respected members of the medical community as a proven means to reduce the anxiety, depression, and suicide ideation that can accompany gender dysphoria. The environment has become so toxic for transgender people here in Texas that some families have fled their homes lest they become the target of investigations by the government.

We have chosen as writers to use the power of theatre to share our family's journey, albeit a fictionalized version of it. By doing so, we hope to raise awareness about what it means to be Trans. We believe that with that growing awareness, Trans individuals will find greater acceptance. Good theatre is a powerful tool. When the audience cares about the characters they see on stage, they end up caring a little bit more about what is going on in the world around them. This is our way — as Mom says in the play — of helping to change the world.

The process of writing this play together has brought us closer as a family. As we explored the mother/son relationship presented in the script, we had to explore our own relationship and the family dynamics surrounding the extraordinary adventure of finding one's true gender identity. The entire experience has been a true joy, both the adventure itself and the writing about it. What more can a parent want than to see their child happy and flourishing!
